4. Processing of criminal extradition matters for jailed

- 6. All court buildings are closed to the public.
- 7. Emergency Motions must be filed at 67thdc.com or mailed to the appropriate court location.
- 8. Evictions are suspended until further Order of the Court.
- 9. Probable Cause Conferences will be conducted remotely at regularly scheduled times. Cases requiring preliminary

examinations will be given control dates of May 14, 2020. Examinations will be scheduled at that time.

- 10. Processing of Forensic Hearings utilizing remote technology to obtain witness testimony.
- 11. The Court will hear civil motions utilizing remote technology where both attorneys consent to participation. Attorneys should contact 67thdc.com to request a time for the hearings.
- 12. The Court anticipates the live streaming of Court hearings via YouTube commencing Thursday, April 23, 2020.
- 13. We encourage attorneys to contact the Court if matters are resolved to make appropriate remote records. Furthermore, where possible, we encourage attorneys to contact appropriate City, State and Township Prosecutors to pre-try misdemeanor cases. If matters are resolved, contact 67thdc.com and court hearing dates will be scheduled for remote resolution.
- 14. The policy of this Court is every effort will be made to conduct hearings safely and remotely. If that can't be accomplished, matters will be adjourned.

The health and safety of court staff and the community are of the utmost concern. We will continue to work with the Michigan Supreme Court and the Genesee County Commissioners to ensure that we are doing all that we can to combat this health emergency situation.
